

OWHA Sanction #1920037

- 1. Hockey Canada and OWHA rules shall apply.
- 2. Peewee AA, Midget A/BB, and Senior B will be 12-15-15. All other divisions will be 10-10-12.
- 3. There will be a 3-minute warm-up prior to each game, which will start following the exit of the Zamboni.
- 4. All teams **MUST** be available to play 30 minutes prior to the scheduled start time.
- 5. All teams are required to show their most up-to-date approved OWHA Roster or USA Hockey Roster to the Tournament Registration Desk for verification purposes.
- 6. All teams must register/sign in at Quinte Sports & Wellness Centre (headquarters) prior to the team's first game of the tournament.
- 7. The OWHA minimum suspension guidelines will be strictly enforced. All suspensions will be enforced according to OWHA 2019-2020 Constitution, By-Laws, Regulations & Rules.
- 8. If the goal differential in any game is five (5) or greater <u>at any time in the third period</u>, the clock with continue to run until the spread is reduced to three (3) then stop time shall resume.
- 9. <u>One 30 second timeout will be allowed for each team ONLY during Elimination, Semi-Final</u> and Final games. Overtime is not a new game. There is **NO TIMEOUT** in Round Robin Games.
- 10. A player may only participate with **one** designated team in a tournament and may only participate in **one** tournament on any date.
- 11. To be eligible to participate in the tournament, the participant's name must appear on the OWHA team roster or USA Hockey Official Roster. The OWHA "Pickup Player for Tournament" form must be utilized for any pick up players. The form must be completed in full and provided at the Tournament Registration Desk prior to the team's first game of tournament. No 'pick up' players will be permitted after the team's first game of the tournament.
- 12. For any misconducts, game misconducts or match penalties received in the preliminary games, ten (10) minutes will be applied to the team's penalty minutes for the particular game wherein the penalty occurred.
- 13. Teams will be awarded 2 points for a win, 1 point for a tie and zero (0) points for a loss.

- 14. Standings after the preliminary/round robin play will be calculated on the basis of the points awarded as per **rule # 13**.
  - In the event of a tie, the following criteria will be used to break the tie:
  - a) Number of wins
  - b) Winner between the tied teams when they played head to head (does not apply if more than two teams tied)
  - c) Percentage as calculated by dividing team's total "Goals For" by the SUM of the team's "Goals For and Goals Against". **TGF / (GF+GA) = %** (See Chart )
  - d) Fewest Goals Against.
  - e) Fewest Penalty Minutes.
  - f) First goal scored in preliminary/round robin.
  - g) Coin Toss.

Follow Tie breaking rules in Order. Once a Tie Breaking Rule has been used or is not applicable it cannot be used again.

- 15. Elimination, Semi-Finals & Championship games are played to a winner. In the event of a tie at the end of regulation time, a Sudden Victory 5-minute overtime (stop time) will commence. Teams will play 4 on 4 PLUS Goalies (See format for rules). Players can be changed at any time. Goalies may be "pulled" at any time and a substitute player from the bench may be used. If still tied, a shoot out will occur.
- 16. Shoot Outs: Teams do not change ends for Overtime or Shoot Outs.

Each team must designate 3 shooters (S1, S2, S3) directly onto the game sheet prior to the start of the game. Any player serving a penalty at the end of overtime will not be eligible to participate in the shoot out. All players except shooter and goalies will be on the bench. Once a player has shot, they will go to the penalty box. Shooters from both teams will shoot at the same time starting at centre ice. All 3 designated shooters from each team will shoot. If still tied, each team will designate one shooter at a time until there is a winner. A player may not shoot for a second time until all players on the game sheet (except goalies) have shot.

- 17. Home teams must wear light coloured jerseys where possible. In the event of a conflict, the home team must change their jerseys.
- 18. All players and team officials must sign the game sheet prior to each game. If a player or team official will be late, they must sign at the penalty box.
- 19. Flooding of the ice will occur at the end of each game for all 10-10-12 games. For 12-15-15 games, flooding will occur after the 2<sup>nd</sup> period and end of the game. Flooding may be deferred at the Tournament Committees discretion.
- 20. It is the team's responsibility to ensure a clean dressing room is left upon completion of their game. All teams are requested to vacate the dressing room 25 minutes or less after their game is completed.
- 21. On-ice officials decisions are final and not subject to appeal or grievance. The decisions of the Tournament Officials are final. No appeals will be allowed.

The Tournament Committee reserves itself the final word on the interpretation of the rules.

## Overtime Rules for Elimination, Semi-Final and Championship Games OWHA Sanction #1920037

- Elimination, Semi-final and Championship games are played to a winner. In the event of a tie at the end of regulation time a SUDDEN VICTORY FIVE (5) MINUTE OVERTIME (stop time) will commence.
- Teams will play 4 on 4 plus goalies. Players can be changed at any time. Goalies may be "pulled" at any time and a substitute player from the bench may be used. If a team is assessed a penalty, then play will be 4 on 3. If a team is assessed a 2<sup>nd</sup> penalty while 1<sup>st</sup> penalty has not expired then play will be 5 on 3. If there is no whistle, it will be 5 on 4 when the first players gets out, and then 5 on 5 when the second girl gets out. It reverts back to 4 on 4 once a whistle occurs.
- If still tied, a shoot out will occur. Teams do not change ends.
- Each team **MUST** designate 3 shooters (S1, S2, S3) on the game sheet <u>prior to the start</u> <u>of the game.</u>
- Any player(s) serving a penalty at the end of overtime will not be eligible to participate in the shoot out. The coach must designate a shooter(s) to take her place(s) immediately at the end of regulation time.
- All players except shooter and goalies will be on the bench to start.
- All 3 designated shooters from each team will shoot. Shooters will shoot at the same time starting at centre ice.
- Once a player has shot, they will go directly to the penalty box.
- If still tied, each team will designate one shooter at a time until there is a winner. A player may not shoot for a second time until all players on the game sheet (except goalies) have shot.
